County Treasurer

County Treasurer acts as the chief liaison between the County and depository bank and works closely with the Terrell County Commissioners Court and acquired audit firm. The treasurer must maintain an accountable checks and balances system. The Treasurer is designated as the County's investment officer and is required to submit regular reports on County finance to the Commissioners Court. The Treasurer's office receives and deposits all County revenue, disbursing funds on the order of the Commissioners Court, records receipts and expenditures and reconciles bank statements, processes all in-going and outgoing treasurers department mail.

The office of the County Treasurer was established by the Texas Constitution in 1846. Elected by voters, the Treasurer serves for four years. The County Treasurer is governed by:

Local Government Code Title 4. Finances Subtitle B. County Finances Chapter 113. Management of County Money Subchapter A. General Provisions

“The Commissioners Court will appoint the Treasurer to serve until the end of the current term December 31, 2026. If the appointed Treasurer Chooses to Run for the office in the next General election, held in November, 2024 he or she may do so.”
